GENERAL COMMUNITY INFORMATION

*** NEW PHOTO ID REQUIREMENT FOR VOTING ***

The government has recently introduced a requirement for voters in England to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections from Thursday 4 May. This will apply to local elections, Police and Crime Commissioner elections, UK parliamentary by-elections and recall petitions. From October 2023, it will also apply to UK general elections. *NOTE: this does not apply to postal votes.*

Individuals who don't have an accepted photo ID can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate. Individuals will be able to use the Voter Authority Certificate to vote in person in some UK elections and referendums. However, it cannot be used as proof of identification for any other reason. It is free, but you need to apply through the government website. Find out more about the voter ID document and how to apply go to www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate.

Warboys Underfives Preschool

Each child at Warboys Underfives has been given a book bag and they are given the opportunity to choose a book from preschool to take home and share with their family. Our older children have enjoyed walks to the local library this month where we have talked about borrowing books and how to look after them. In preschool we have been mixing colours at the art easel and using paper plates at the collage table to make pictures of ourselves or our friends. We have encouraged the children to think about what we look like and looked at ourselves in the mirror. We have been bathing the dolls in the water tray and using towels to dry them whilst discussing what we know about looking after babies and have enjoyed making ramps and tunnels for our vehicles to travel across. In our maths area we have been pairing numbered socks and weighing out pasta on the scales to explore heavier, lighter, up and down.

Numbers have been dotted around the preschool to encourage observance and to consolidate number recognition.

Warboys Underfives continues to support Warboys Greener Futures' initiative to encourage recycling beyond what is accepted in a household's blue bin. We provide a collection point by our back gate for soft plastic packaging - empty baby wipe packets, make up packets, bread bags etc that is available for both our families and the community to access. Our committee then transport the collected packaging to our local soft plastic recycling points and have, since the scheme began, saved 20 bin bags full of plastic from the landfill.

- *We had a Brown Owl (Brenda Pilbeam) and Tawny Owl (Brenda Beebe) just like 1st Warboys Brownies today! Our uniform was very different though! I was in the Imps six and became Imps sixer during my time as a Brownie. I remember most our brownie toadstool and owls. We would set these up for the beginning of our meeting each week and then form a horseshoe shape round them and maybe sing.*
- *We played really fun games- Kim's game was a favourite! We all used to love playing 'ladders' which was fun and fast, lots of giggles but someone nearly always fell over so it's probably banned these days!*
- *My ship sailed from China ...look it up if you don't know it!

- *Hostess badge - this was one of the very first badges we earned as a Brownie. We would invite parents in to have tea and biscuits which we would make and serve with teacups and saucers! We would also chat to the mums that came to be served tea!*
- *Church parade - (I think) one Sunday EVERY month! We would meet at the library and parade with our flags up the high street to the church.*
- *We did a talent show! I sang Every Loser Wins by Nick Berry (an actor from Eastenders!)*
- *I used to LOVE my brownie handbook! Everything you needed to know about being a brownie, and most importantly all the badges.*
- *Having to take my 10p to the telephone box and ring brown owl to show I could use a public telephone!*
- *Pocket inspections! We always had to have our 10p, hankie, plaster, string, pencil, and piece of paper in our purses on our belts.*
- *Best Brownie award 🏆*
- *Brownie promise 'I promise that I'll do my best and do my duty to god, to serve the queen and help other people, and to keep the Brownie Guide law'*

This figure has not really changed much over the past 5 years, but there is a need for building more Prisons as there is considerable overcrowding. A very thought-provoking talk.

Our President, Joyce, welcomed everyone, and gave a short explanation of the WI Charity we are raising funds for. 



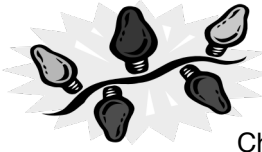

Warboys Christmas Lighting Group Update – Spring 2023

After the group has fully recovered over the winter from the fantastic Switch On event last November, they are now embarking on 2023 Fundraising and Switch On plans with the new Chair in place and raring to go!

Changes for 2023 lighting erection and take down: due to ongoing safety concerns and temporary road closure during the operation, the group has decided to instruct a professional company Merlin to do the laborious task of fixing up the displays around the village. The group feels that as the village is getting ever busier and our equipment being less and less suitable to take on the task safely, it would not be worth it if an accident were to occur involving a group member, pedestrian, or vehicle. The contractor's fees, however, will need to be covered through fundraising in addition to the Parish contribution.

New Displays: Plan to buy two refurbished lighting displays for Mill Green end of the Village, these are circa £400 each plus another £400 each for the installation of the timers onto the posts. The Group has decided that unless a sponsor comes forward to cover the cost of the new timer installations, set to cost around £800, these displays will have the costs spread into 2024 so that we will see them erected for the 2024 Christmas period rather than this year.

The Great British Spring Clean

The great British Spring Clean 2023 is upon us, as hundreds of people across Huntingdonshire prepare to take to our streets and green spaces, armed with litter pickers, gloves and bags, to remove as much litter as possible.

The first Great British Spring Clean was introduced back in 1989 with founders, Keep Britain Tidy, enlisting the assistance of children entertainers, The Wombles, alongside an estimated 2 million volunteers across the Country, to litter pick within and around their local area. With such a success, it was only suiting to continue this year upon year, not only to help in the clearance of litter but to raise awareness of the disastrous effects litter has.

2023 marks a prominent year for our waste team, with new litter picking groups forming all over our district, bringing likeminded individuals together to tackle a common problem.

Litter remains a serious issue across Huntingdonshire, not only looking unsightly, but having a dramatic effect on our local wildlife and the surrounding environment. The Huntingdonshire District Council, continue to spend valuable time and resources to eradicate litter, utilising their street cleaning team, although in many cases it returns as quickly as it's collected. The Huntingdonshire District Council recently commission a road clearance exercise, along the verges of the B1043 commonly known as the old A1. Thus far, a staggering 308 bags of litter have been collected over a period of 4 days, equating to an estimated 3 tonne of rubbish; a key indicator that littering is a distinct problem, with still more of that stretch to cover.

Littering is a national problem, not just localised to Huntingdonshire, and without the help of volunteer groups picking at their leisure, it would be mounting up on a scale that is uncontrollable. We therefore appeal to you to ensure that you as an individual, do your utmost to dispose of waste in a correct manner, utilising bins provided within your surroundings or alternatively taken home.



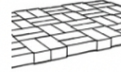
